

Homestead Exemption Applications Due by March 1, 2010.

If you've had any change in home ownership in 2009, apply for Homestead Exemption before Monday, March 1, 2010.

Applicants need two forms of Florida identification (driver's license, voter registration card, vehicle tag numbers) and Social Security numbers.

You may apply by visiting the Property Appraiser's Office at 480 W. Walnut Street (behind the old historic High School on West 90). Between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Agricultural Classification Applications Due by March 1, 2010.

IMPORTANT: Agricultural Classification is not transferable. If the property is sold or transferred from one ownership to another, a new application must be filed. If any changes in the use of the property it is important to notify the Property Appraiser's office.

Pursuant to Florida Statutes 193.461(3)(a), "... Only lands which are used primarily for bona fide agricultural purposes shall be classified as agricultural. "Bona fide agricultural purposes" means good faith commercial agricultural use of land."

Conservation Exemption/ Classification Applications Due by March 1, 2010.

Conservation Exemption:

- Instrument in place by January 1st;
- 40 contiguous acres;
- Dedicated in perpetuity and used exclusively for conservation purposes (if used for allowed commercial purposes, the exemption is up to 50% of the land value)

Conservation Classification:

- Instrument in place by January 1st;
- Conveys the development right or establishes a covenant for the conservation purposes of the land for 10 years or more.

\$25,000 Tangible Personal Property Exemptions & Returns Due April 1, 2010

Businesses need to file for the \$25,000 exemption on tangible personal property. Filing a tangible personal property tax return (DR405) is considered the application for the \$25,000 exemption.

All returns must be filed by **April 1st**. A return filed after the April 1 deadline may not qualify.

If you received a blue exemption renewal post card, and have not made any additional equipment purchases, you **DO NOT** need to file a return.
